Methodology: Online. The live webinars will take place from 14:00 to 18:00 CEST (08:00 am to

12:00 pm EST), from Monday to Friday.

Content: The Summer School aims to provide participants with a nuanced understanding of the complex relationship between AI, ethics, and human rights, equipping them with interdisciplinary knowledge and critical awareness to evaluate AI's role in society. It offers professional, legal, social, scientific, and academic perspectives through lectures, interactive debates, case studies, and expert insights.


Methodology: Hybrid modality. Classes will take place at LUMSA Human Academy in Rome (Italy), from Monday to Friday, from 09:30 to 16:30 CEST, and will be streamed via a dedicated online platform following the same schedule.

Organising institutions: UNICRI in cooperation with Rome City Institute (RCI).



International legal and policy frameworks will be examined to strengthen participants' ability to address these challenges effectively and to support their role in promoting transparency, accountability, and ethical standards across sport organisations, public institutions, and multi-stakeholder environments.

Methodology: Classes are held in person at Rome City Institute Campus in Rome (Italy), from Monday to Friday, from 9:30 to 16:30 CEST.

Target audience: The course is designed for university and post-graduate students in Sports Management, Law, Political Science, International Relations, Economics, Social Sciences, and other related fields. It is also suitable for professionals working in governmental bodies, local authorities, as well as international and non-governmental organizations, seeking to deepen their understanding of sport governance, integrity, and ethical challenges, including issues related to corruption, match-fixing, financial crime, and accountability in sport.

Final certification: Upon completion of the entire Summer School programme, participants will receive a certificate of participation jointly issued by the United Nations and Rome City Institute.

Organising institutions: UNICRI and SIOI - Italian Society for International Organization.


Content: The Summer School aims to provide participants with a fundamental understanding of the various dimensions of disinformation, hate speech, and fake news, including the role of social media in war and political propaganda campaigns. The existing international legal and policy frameworks will be examined to improve participants' ability to address the issue comprehensively and promote their role as advocates for an effective change in public policies, strategies, and practices.

Methodology: Hybrid modality. Classes will take place from Monday to Friday from 09:30 to 16:30 CEST, either in-person at SIOI premises in Rome, Italy, or online, via a dedicated online platform.

Target audience: The course is intended for university and post-graduate students, PhD candidates, media and other professionals, including United Nations (UN) personnel, as well as anyone interested in gaining an understanding of disinformation, misinformation, and hate speech; how they manifest themselves and what tools are available to combat them.

Final certification: Upon completion of the entire Summer School programme, participants will receive a certificate of participation jointly released by the United Nations and SIOI.

Methodology: In-person. Classes will take place at John Cabot University in Rome (Italy), from Monday to Friday from 09:30 to 16:30 CEST.

Target audience: The course is designed for university graduates in Law, Political Science, International Relations, Economics, Social Science, and other relevant disciplines. It is also suitable for young professionals working in governmental institutions, local authorities, international and non-governmental organizations, seeking to deepen their understanding of current human rights issues affecting migrants.

Final certification: Upon completion of the entire Summer School programme, participants will receive a certificate of participation jointly issued by the United Nations and John Cabot

University.
